

## Invitation to PLAN BOTHNIA Baltic Sea Region Stakeholder Meeting 6 February 2012 Riga, Latvia Monika Centrum Hotels, meeting room "Glory", Elizabetes street 21, Riga

Largely due to recent interest in developments on maritime areas, among others wind powers, many coastal countries around Europe are engaged in the new field of Maritime Spatial Planning (MSP). In the Baltic Sea a new intergovernmental group on the topic has started its work in 2010: a joint HELCOM-VASAB Maritime Spatial Planning Working Group. Also a couple of maritime spatial planning development projects are being carried out right now in the Baltic Sea area.

The PLAN BOTHNIA project (Dec 2010-May 2012) concretely tests joint transboundary MSP in a large area (ca 350x250km) covering the Bothnian Sea, a part of the Baltic Sea between Finland and Sweden. The project focuses on offshore areas and thus not directly covers any dry land. Now in its twelfth month the project has created background material on activities in the Bothnian Sea and is working on future scenarios for this sea basin.

As part of its dissemination activities the project partner VASAB organizes a public stakeholder event on 6 February 2012 in Riga, Latvia to inform and discuss about the project context, progress and results of the two studies on minimum requirements for MSP, as well as to link to other activities in the same field. This event is mainly targeted to those stakeholders around the Baltic Sea Region (BSR) who are not previously involved in the project activities but are interested to use provided opportunity to discuss progress and next steps of the Plan Bothnia project.

The working language of the event will be English.

### Aims:

1. Introduction to Plan Bothnia project and its present situation to all interested participants
2. Present and discuss links to recent Baltic Sea and European developments
3. Present and discuss the project study on minimum requirements for MSP and best practices in applying MSP principles
4. Present other MSP activities and discuss their links to Plan Bothnia


